



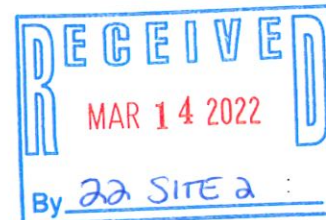

245 Norwich-New London Road / Route 32  
Town of Montville


The Department of Transportation (Department) has reviewed your latest plans for the above-noted subject received February 16, 2022, entitled, "Zoning Improvement Location & Topographic Plan – 245 Norwich-New London Road – Montville, Connecticut" dated January 4, 2022. Your submittal/application to work within the State right of way or perform work that may affect State property is denied based on the following comments:

1. Proof of Town approval must be submitted prior to the issuance of an encroachment permit.
2. Provide turning movement analysis that an SU-30 design vehicle can make a right turn out of the proposed drive without encroaching over the centerline.
3. Call out the radius on the plans for the proposed driveway.
4. Revise plans to show limits of pavement restoration according to current Conn DOT standards for the proposed sewer connection on Route 32. Excavations into a lane will require restoration from the curb to the center line of the roadway or the closest pavement seam. Excavations crossing the center line will require curb to curb restoration. Milling limits must extend a minimum of 10' beyond the edges of the trench. Please include the latest Department of Transportation detail sheet for Pavement Restoration on the plans. When you resubmit, please provide two sets of plans, 40 scale or larger, reflecting the above-noted comments. Please note that any resubmission may generate additional comments and concerns and in no way guarantees the issuance of an encroachment permit. An encroachment permit must be obtained prior to performing any work within or affecting the highway right of way.
