- Podcast Update
 - Grace has taken on so many other important duties, also losing our Production
 Manager, Jimsly due to graduation and moving away to college
 - o Looking for a few kids to share the podcast starting back up in the fall
- Suicide Walk on 4/30/22
 - MYSB's relationship with Transformation Church & their very active youth group resulted in them representing Montville at the Suicide Walk, which had about 250 people in attendance
- <u>Summer Center</u> Registration began Monday 5/9 still have some spots available Program operates Tues/Wed/Thurs 8:00 a.m. until 5:30 (extended one hour this year to accommodate working sche3dules for families!)

- <u>Lunch & Learn series</u>: MYSB Working with Asst. Superintendent Dianne Vumback on this project. First one held in late March with Safe Futures –focusing on healthy relationships, self-advocacy, & more Officer Michaels of Montville Police co-presented with SF staff. More L & L's planned for the upcoming school year. Next up Race, and Social & Racial Equity
- Benefit Concert: Still tickets available for Kane Brown on June 5th! Skybox seating!
- •<u>Trainings & Certifications</u>: Barbara became certified in Psychological First Aide and PTSD Therapy. SERAC offering a lot of good trainings and Barbara will be attending a new training regarding Black & Indigenous people & Suicide Prevention, Also, 20 more students will be trained in QPR in May. DCF also offering trainings in understanding and recognizing sex trafficking (A larger discussion on this topic ensued). Loretta did share that a support group for youth in this situation called LOVE146. (Maybe another Lunch & Learn Topic!)
- •Ascension Film: Screened at MHS on 5-11 this film was shared with the community through SERAC to spread hope and fight suicide. Dan shared that it triggered something in him to do more to help & Susan added that maybe having a "Hope Squad" might be good, but wondered if kids would open up to a stranger(statistics support that "yes" they often do!)

V. YAC (Youth Action Council) No YAC members present due to sports conflicts)

- Stall Street Journal May Edition focused on Mental Health with support and resources shared
- QR Codes posted throughout schools and community with links to MH resources in the schools and the community
- The Day paper interviewed both Brendan & Jimsly about the work YAC has done with MH over the past several months (GREAT ARTICLE!)

VII. JRB Update (Cases, Dispositions, Referrals) – looking to rename in the future

 - Very busy! A lot of cannabis arrests for possession and distribution which results in student expulsions (lots of discussion about this matter resulted)

 - A lot is happening on the JJ front in terms of legislation (stay tuned)

VIII. Other Business

 <u>Grants (State & Local)</u>: Both line items fully funded in Gov's budget (with some increases, too!) under DCF. CYSA Advocacy team did a lot of work testifying and submitting testimony in support of YSBs! • JRBs also received an increase in their line item under DCF.

• Budgets (State & Local)

- MYSB no cuts so far in Mayors' budget supported 2 increases
- 2 million enhancement for all YSBs which Montville could receive \$10,000 \$15,000
- o ARPA funds focusing a lot on Mental Health Services & programs
- Other business: Project Courage (for substance abuse support)
- Seeking out male counselors for adolescent boys
- Fall of 2022 MYSB will have another LPC intern working 18 hours per week which will create more counseling slots!
