- Multiple issues, so much more than babysitting important for the community to know
- Participants are highly energetic which is wonderful lots of basketball, volleyball, art on Fridays, homework help

Mobile Van

- Using Federal Opioid Funds
- 2 RNs manage the van blood pressure, clean needle exchange, access to resources, tick test, Covid and flu vaccines, etc – multiple tests and resources available
- o Confidential and free

V. YAC (Youth Action Council) (Adam Sheridan & Josie English)

- Athlete Mental Health Survey
 - 79% feel pressure to succeed
 - o 46% feel comfortable talking to coach about mental health
 - o 60% feel comfortable talking to teammates about mental health
 - 4% think vaping is okay despite it being illegal
 - o 38% of student athletes use energy drinks to "push through"

• Social Media Survey 6th & 7th Grade

- About ½ of the 6th and 7th graders completed the survey
- Not sure how truthful they were on answering
- o Once completed YAC will meet to discuss World Cafes

• Energy Drinks

- Social media and Stall Street Journal will highlight the dangers of energy drinks and participating in sports
- o We will be setting a table up in cafeteria in April
